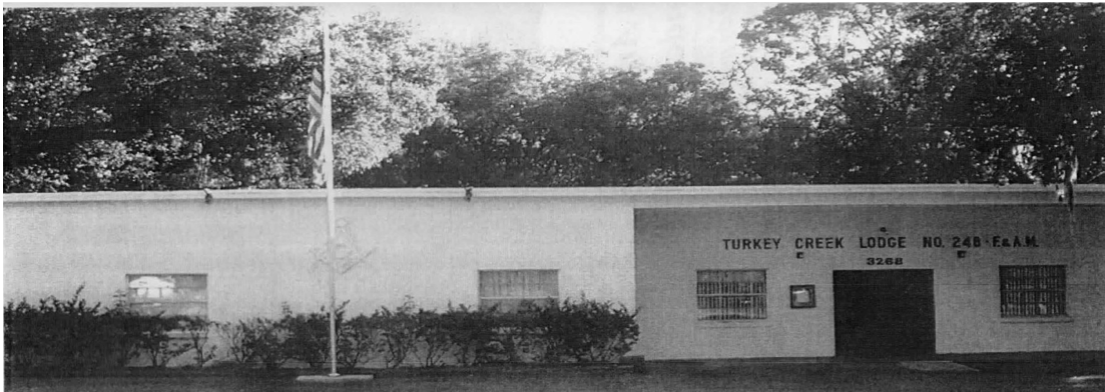

From the Secretary



Several members of Turkey Creek Lodge No 248, F&AM, attended the 100-Man Initiative at A. W. Windhorst Lodge No 185, F&AM, April 14, 2016. The goal of the 100-Man Initiative was to get at least 100 Master Masons to attend a designated communication. At the formal head count at the end of the communication, there were 111 Master Masons present; several having left for one reason or another during the communication. I cannot recall seeing that many people at a called or stated communication except at a funeral service, and I'm sure there were not 100 Master Masons present even then. I was impressed to see that many Master Masons from all over Hillsborough County and Pasco County come together for a common purpose.

Brethren, a hundred years ago, even 70 years ago, Masonry was an important part of community life. Masonry should still be an important part of community life. Just observe the coarsening of manners and the loss of moral values in our society if you doubt that statement. Masonry is not what one does at a meeting one night a month, or even 15-20 nights a month, depending on how active one is with the various Masonic bodies available. Masonry is what one does with one's moral and spiritual life. After all, the motto of Masonry is to help good men become better men. To help in that quest, each Mason was pointed to the Volume of Sacred Law upon the Altar during the several obligations.

The value of Freemasonry, and attending the stated or called communications, is the association with other men with the same moral and spiritual values one has. You may be a different race, ethnicity or faith from the Mason next to you but all Masons should share the same values. Turkey Creek Lodge has over 100 members. However, with the geographical dispersion of the members, coupled with age and infirmity, it would be difficult to do a 100-Man Initiative with just the members of Turkey Creek Lodge. However, a 40-, or even 50-Man Initiative would not be out of the question. Are you up to it? How long has it been since you last attended a called or stated communication?

¹ The LORD spoke to Moses, saying,

² “Speak to the people of Israel and say to them, These are the appointed feasts of the LORD that you shall proclaim as holy convocations; they are my appointed feasts. Leviticus 23:1-2

We as Masons understand teaching by types, it is mentioned at our first introduction to the fraternity. The “appointed feasts of the LORD” are not only to celebrate an historical event in Israel’s past but are also a “type” to teach us of the greater event to come. While our Jewish brothers still celebrate the appointed feasts for the reasons given in the Old Testament, Christian theology sees some of them as completed types or Antitypes.

The Passover was the slaying of the Lamb of God, the celebration of First Fruits which is celebrated three days later, points to Jesus as the first to rise from the dead which Christians celebrate as Easter and the Feast of Weeks which is celebrated fifty days later corresponds to Pentecost (a Greek word for fifty) when the Holy Spirit was sent by Jesus and celebrates the beginning of the Christian Church. Last month Easter was celebrated and this month our Jewish brothers celebrate “The Passover”.

In the past the two celebrations were celebrated at the same time, but were subsequently separated. The Jewish feasts are always on the same day of the month, but to correspond to the solar calendar, Easter has a more complicated date calculation which is still based on the lunar cycle. This leaves three more “appointed feasts” to be fulfilled. It is interesting to think of what they may be a “type of”. This is definitely not meant to be a thorough study of the Religious Festivals but to get us thinking about the mysteries and wondrous things contained in our Great Light of Masonry.

O Lord, Open my eyes, that I may see wondrous things from Your law.
